This for me was the passing of my mom, in which the death certificate states she took her own life. My life was shattered, and it was up to me to pick up the pieces and put myself back together. To do this, I had to heal the generation wounds that were given to me as a gift I was forced to open, one that I chose to look at with the eyes of a hurt little girl, a scared woman, and a role model for my daughters. I knew I had to change the narrative. "Why me?" turned into, "Why not me?", and began the journey with my babies by my side. Many beautiful memories and obstacles to overcome led me to my career in the mental health field. I don't work, I get to sit with my clients and have real conversations, ones that are raw and sacred, ones that heal. I see who they are when they can't see themselves. We are all covered up in the pain of life, protecting our hearts from the hurt that is inevitable. Being vulnerable is the bridge to connection, and connection is love. There is power in facing your fears, choosing a different way, and living your life with your eyes wide open. Yes, life can be painful, but in that pain lies the beauty of living. Our hearts keep us alive, honor it by feeling it in the moments of truth.

I was a single mom the entire time I was a full-time college student. There

wasn't anything that would stop what I knew I had to do for my daughters, and myself. I had to teach all of us that we can do anything we set our hearts and minds to—just like our Grandma Frances would say.

I immersed myself into motherhood as I mothered myself. My message to the reader is to never lose sight of the life that you dream of. It is already inside of you, waiting to be discovered. Therapy helps you take away the layers of protection that used to keep you safe, but now keep you lonely. I see you because I finally see ME. ✨
